Singapore Unveils *Dendrobium Andrew Parsons* in Honour of International Paralympic Committee President

The Singapore National Paralympic Council (SNPC), together with the National Parks Board (NParks), officially unveiled a new orchid hybrid – *Dendrobium Andrew Parsons* – in honour of Mr. Andrew Parsons, President of the International Paralympic Committee (IPC), at a ceremony held today at the National Orchid Garden.

The ceremony was graced by Mr Edwin Tong, Minister for Law and Second Minister for Home Affairs, together with Ms Huang Yu-Ning, Chief Executive Officer of NParks, Dr Teo-Koh Sock Miang, President of the SNPC, alongside senior representatives from SNPC and members of the sporting fraternity.

Mr Parsons has been at the helm of the IPC since 8 September 2017, when he was first elected at the 18th IPC General Assembly in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates. He was subsequently re-elected for a second term in 2021. Over the years, Mr Parsons has been instrumental in advocating and advancing the global Paralympic Movement, strengthening inclusion, and amplifying the voices of para athletes worldwide.

About Dendrobium Andrew Parsons

This tall and majestic hybrid produces upright to gently arching inflorescences 60 to 70 cm in length, each bearing up to 34 mildly scented, well-arranged flowers, 6 to 7 cm across. The gracefully curled petals form a distinctive victory-like gesture, symbolic of triumph and resilience, echoing the spirit of the athletic excellence. The sepals and petals are chartreuse with golden tones, while the lip is vivid mauve and delicately veined in deep purple.

This orchid is named after Mr Andrew Parsons, President of The International Paralympic Committee, on the occasion of his visit to the National Orchid Garden on 19 September 2025.
