**Team Singapore Unveils 20-Athlete Contingent Across Nine Sports for the
Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games**

SINGAPORE, 12 September 2026 – Team Singapore will be represented by 20 athletes across nine sports at Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games in Japan from 18 to 24 October 2026, following the nomination by the Singapore National Paralympic Council (SNPC). The contingent received the Singapore flag at the Flag Presentation Ceremony held today at Gardens by the Bay, marking a key milestone ahead of the Games.



During the ceremony, Guest-of-Honour Mr David Neo, Minister for Culture, Community and Youth & Second Minister for Education, presented the Singapore flag to Mr Low See Lien, Chef de Mission for Team Singapore at Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games. Team Singapore para athletics athlete, Mr James Ethan Ang Kai Meng was also unveiled as the flag bearer for the Opening Ceremony.

The 20-athlete contingent will compete in Para Archery, Para Athletics, Para Badminton, Boccia, Para Cycling (Road), Para Judo, Para Swimming, Shooting Para Sport, and Para Table Tennis. Eight athletes will be making their Asian Para Games debut, alongside experienced Paralympians and returning Asian Para Games athletes.

Mr Low, who is also the Vice President of the Singapore National Paralympic Council (SNPC) previously served as Chef de Mission at the 2022 ASEAN Para Games in Solo, Indonesia. He said, "It is a privilege to lead Team Singapore to the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games. Our athletes have shown tremendous commitment and dedication in preparing for the Games, and our focus now is to ensure that every athlete and team official is well prepared for the challenge ahead."

"We look forward to supporting our athletes as they take on Asia's best, and I hope Singaporeans will rally behind them as they represent Singapore with pride at the Games."

On being named Flag Bearer, Mr James Ethan Ang said, "It is a great honour to carry the Singapore flag at the Opening Ceremony. To me, it represents the entire Team Singapore contingent, and I am proud to stand with my fellow athletes as we give our best for Singapore."

Dr Teo-Koh Sock Miang, President of the Singapore National Paralympic Council, added, "This contingent reflects the continued progress of para sport in Singapore and the commitment our athletes, coaches, families and support teams who have journeyed alongside them. Representing Singapore at the Asian Para Games is a



significant achievement, and we are proud of every athlete who has earned this opportunity. We look forward to seeing them compete with confidence and give their best.”

The Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games will be the fifth edition of the Games, bringing together around 3,000 leading para athletes from Asia to compete across 18 sports.
